A TALE OF LOVE, AMBITION, VIIGILANTES, and VIOLENCE

The California Supreme Court Historical Society and the Northern District of California Historical Society will jointly present a program on Monday October 15, featuring an "all star" cast of seven State and federal justices and judges, including California Supreme Court justices Marvin Baxter and Kathryn Werdegar. The program will draw on events in the tumultuous life and violent death of early California Chief Justice David Terry (one of the most colorful and controversial men ever to serve on the State High Court) to dramatize the evolution of federal power in 19th Century California.

The justices and judges will be taking the parts of Terry, United States Senator David Broderick (whom Terry killed in a duel), United States Supreme Court Justice Stephen Field (whom Terry assaulted) , and U.S. Marshal David Neagle (who shot and killed Terry), along with other notable historical figures from California, and the US Supreme Court justices who decided Marshal Neagle's fate.

The program will be held at the Milton Marks Auditorium in the State Office Building in San Francisco's Civic Center, 455 Golden Gate Avenue, San Francisco 94102. More details, including the justices and judges who are participating, are shown on the announcement reproduced below.
