He is a member of, and served as the first chair of, the firm's financial services practice group. Mr. Brandel has served as Chair of the ABA's Consumer Financial Services Committee, Chair of the California State Bar's Financial Institution Committee, Chair of the Legal Advisory Committee of the National Center on Financial Services, Chair of the California State Bar Business Law Section, and President of the American College of Consumer Financial Services Lawyers.
