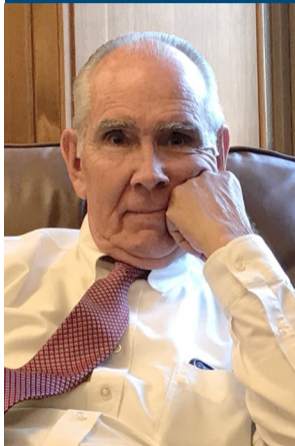


CALIFORNIA LEGAL HISTORY'S NEW EDITOR

SEEING “an opportunity to . . . teach law, ethics, civility, and collegiality through legal history, with balance,” former Justice George (“Nick”) Nicholson has agreed to edit *California Legal History* following the retirement of Selma Moidel Smith. Nicholson, who served for 28 years on the Court of Appeal, Third Appellate District, and earlier, as an Alameda County prosecutor and a judge on the Sacramento Municipal and Superior Courts, began his writing career as the sports editor of his high school and college newspapers. Nick began playing baseball in 1950. His baseball heroes were and have remained Branch Rickey and Jackie Robinson. For more than 70 years, he has played, coached, managed, and taught baseball “I have been seriously editing and writing for almost 70 years,” he noted, including appellate opinions, articles for legal publications, and frequent commentaries in major newspapers.
